# About the Transforming Access to Water Sanitation and Hygiene and Nutrition Services in Mozambique (T WASH)

**Transforming Access to Water Sanitation and Hygiene and Nutrition Services in Mozambique (T WASH)** is a program with nationwide coverage, created to deliver sustainable and resilient water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH) and nutrition services for rural communities through support to the Government of Mozambique's PRONASAR (National Rural Water and Sanitation Programme).

T WASH covers the period from September 2021 to September 2026.

SNV has 2 main components:

1. Capacity building;
2. Fund management.

The components of the T WASH have been developed based on lessons learned during the five years of implementation of the T WASH programme (2015 – 2020).

All objectives have been designed to focus on improving the performance of government stakeholders at different levels: district, provincial and national governments and the interaction between them.

## Expected outcomes

- Around 250,000 people will have access to new water supply services by September 2026;
- More than 100,000 people will have access to new sanitation services by September 2026;
- More than 100,000 people will have improved nutrition-sensitive hygiene practices within 60 months;
- The programme will have contributed to improving WASH climate for around 215,000 people by September 2026;
- Decentralisation of up to 80% of total funds for direct management by provincial and district governments ensured



## Expected results

- Central, provincial and district governments respond to demand for the provision of improved and inclusive WASH services in targeted rural communities;
- Improved and coordinated availability and provision of nutrition-sensitive hygiene and sanitation, through interventions linked to social behaviour change;
- Central government supports the improvement of sub-national provision and monitoring systems, through effective decentralisation of WASH services;
- Targeted communities supported to better adapt to the effects of climate change through the provision of resilient water and sanitation services (ICF funding);
- Conformity of the investment to the Fund, including a better quality/price ratio with a sustained increase in the provision and utilisation of WASH services in rural areas.
