SNV currently works in the sectoral areas of Agri-Food Systems, Water, and Energy, collaborating closely with government, local development partners, private sector, knowledge institutes, and lowincome communities to transform ideas into results.

Besides helping achieve household-level impact, SNV contributes to systems change to ensure the long-term sustainability of interventions. SNV helps develop livelihoods and improve the wellbeing of Mozambicans by fostering inclusive development and systemic change, supporting locally owned approaches, strengthening governance systems, and improving markets for people living in poverty.

BRILHO - Energy Africa | 2019-2026

BRILHO is a programme that will catalyse Mozambique's off-grid energy market in order to provide clean and affordable energy solutions to the country's off-grid population. BRILHO's overall goal is to improve and increase energy access for people and businesses, leading to money saving and improved well-being and livelihood opportunities for low-income populations.

T WASH II | 2021-2026

Transforming Access to Water Sanitation and Hygiene and Nutrition Services II is a project with nationwide coverage, created to deliver sustainable and resilient water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH) and nutrition services for rural communities through support to the Government of Mozambique's PRONASAR programme. The TWASH II aims to reduce waterborne diseases and improve the wellbeing of rural populations by building the capacity of government to respond to and deliver effective and efficient decentralized WASH services, combined with large scale fund management component to contract and deliver resilient and sensitive WASH services.

Strengthening Sustainability of Sasol's WASH programme | 2020-2025

The Strengthening Sustainability of Sasol's WASH programme (SSoS WASH) was developed by SNV with Sasol. SNV will support Sasol in realising this approach through a five-year WASH project in Inhambane, focusing on improving, rehabilitating, and sustaining water supply services, positively changing behaviours to keep systems operational, and promoting improved hygiene practices. The project will reach 40,000 people from 7,600 households and will also involve 12 schools and 7 health centres serving the 37 target communities.

GoTAS Phase III | 2022-2026

GoTAS Phase III, is a Governance Program in Water, Sanitation and Health, implemented in partnership with the INGO United Purpose. It aims to improve the living conditions of the rural population in seven Districts of Niassa Province through the provision of rural WASH services promoting effective decentralization and active participation of citizens organized through decision-making forums.

Supporting AIAS in Water and Sanitation Service Delivery to small towns in Mozambique – Phase II | 2021-2025

In support of the government's national programme to improve water and sanitation services across 75 small towns, SNV is responsible for development of sanitation plans, mobilisation of school sanitation clubs, and support for sanitation demand creation and construction of public toilet blocks. We help develop the sanitation supply chain by training local artisans, introducing technologies and coaching sanitation entrepreneurs.

Small Town Sanitations | 2022-2024

The Small Town Sanitation (STS) project will enable the delivery of improved, equitable sanitation to more than 500,000 people in 10 towns across Cabo Delgado, Nampula, and Zambezia provinces.

The project will facilitate the creation of systems, services, and norms that will drive long-term uptake of improved sanitation.

Green Jobs for Youth in Northern Mozambique (GeraSol) | Mozambique | 2024-2028

The GeraSol project is aimed at youth employment and entrepreneurship in the renewable energy sector in the three Mozambican provinces of Niassa, Nampula and Cabo Delgado. The project is a Public-Private Development Partnership that builds on SNV's pioneering work and experience in both supporting access to energy and creating jobs for young people in Mozambique. The project combines qualified young people with emerging roles in a growing renewable energy market, with particular emphasis on Solar Home Systems.

Transformative Land Investment (TLI) | Myanmar, Laos, Ethiopia, Ghana and Mozambique | 2022--2025




