About the Green Jobs for Youth in Northern Mozambique (GeraSol)

GeraSol aims to create jobs and business opportunities for young people in the renewable energy sector. GeraSol's overall goal is to support young men and women to succeed in job and entrepreneurship opportunities in the renewable energy sector in Niassa, Nampula and Cabo Delgado.

The project will select and train young Mozambicans who have the interest and skills to succeed in DRE jobs. Those selected will receive comprehensive job-readiness training composed of a mix of foundational skills, technical training and company-specific induction based on the employment or entrepreneurial roles they choose.

Training courses will be delivered by the Instituto Industrial e Comercial de Nampula (IICN).

Key objectives

- Increase access to employment and entrepreneurial skills development in the renewable energy sector for young people;
- Support the right young people to obtain the right skills and be matched with wage-earning and self-employment jobs that fit both their interests and company expansion demands;
- Support 3 companies to better identify, train, and retain young people who can achieve business and energy access outcomes in Northern Mozambique;
- Develop and share a public-private energy sector partnership model that may be replicable in other regions.

Expected outcomes

- 3,000 young people made aware of renewable energy job opportunities;
- 3,000 young people trained (25% women, 5% displaced youth);
- 2,000 young people matched with roles and jobs within the renewable energy sector;
- 1,000 youth receive start-up capital/support;
- 1,000 youth supported by on-the-job training and coaching.
