



About the Small Town Sanitation

The Small Town Sanitation (STS) project will enable the delivery of improved, equitable sanitation to more than 500,000 people in 10 towns across Cabo Delgado, Nampula, and Zambezia provinces. The lead implementation organisation is PSI.

In households, communities, businesses, and government offices, the project will facilitate the creation of systems, services, and norms that will drive long-term uptake of improved sanitation.

The project's overall goal is to improve the well-being of target communities, especially women and girls", through strengthening the sustainable market of sanitation products and services in small towns.

STS will also promote women's leadership roles and business development in the Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH) sector.
