## About the GOTAS project

In its third phase, GOTAS is a Governance programme in Water, Sanitation and Health (WASH). The overall goal of the project is to improve the health and socioeconomic well-being of the women, men, girls and boys in Niassa Province by reducing the incidence of water and sanitation related diseases.

The project is being implemented jointly by the Provincial government of Niassa as well as an international organizations NGO consortium led by SNV and United Purpose.

Key target groups are the population of seven districts (approx. 653,000 inhabitants), local community-based and civil society organizations, provincial and district authorities in Niassa Province, and private sector cooperatives and artisans working in the WASH sector.

### Expected results

- **Demand side:** Women and men living in rural areas can express their needs and rights and demand responsibility from local governments and the private sector to provide basic WASH services.

- **Supply side:** District decentralized systems (district government, private sector, water and sanitation committees) have provided more equitable, efficient and integrated health, including high- quality basic WASH services that meet the needs of the vulnerable and disadvantaged population.
- **Learning, dialogue and political influence:** Improve sector approaches through local realities' evidence, engage in national level dialogue and influence the institutionalization of program approaches through policy change, adoption and practice.

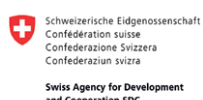

**Project duration:** 2022 – 2026

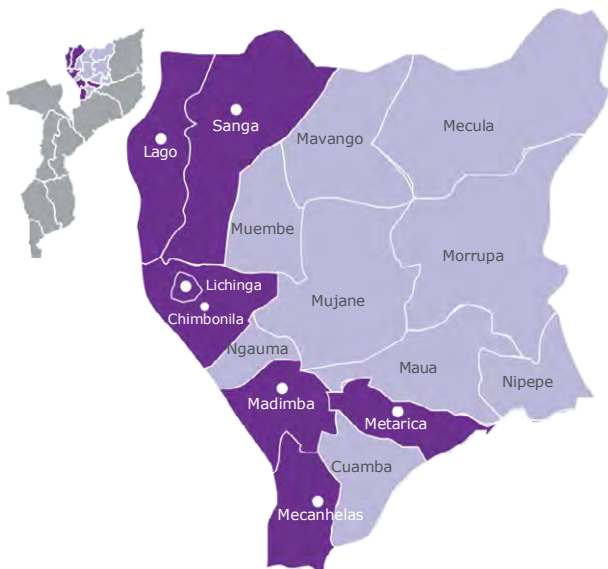
